- 2 Cattle (except cattle not specified as "domestic cattle" in the schedule to the Dangerous Wild Animals Act 1976 (Modification) (Scotland) Order 2008).
- Dogs (except dogs not specified as "domestic dogs" in the schedule to the Dangerous Wild Animals Act 1976 (Modification) (Scotland) Order 2008).
- 4 Domestic budgerigars.
- 5 Domestic ducks.
- 6 Domestic ferrets.
- Domestic fowl (as defined in section 2(1) of the Poultry Breeding Flocks and Hatcheries Order 1993).
- 8 Domestic geese.
- 9 Domestic goats.
- Domestic horses (including ponies, donkeys and mules).
- 11 Domestic pigeons.

 - (ii) being displayed or exhibited,
- (b) which may include other acts of entertainment not involving animals (but need not),>

- (1) The Scottish Ministers may by regulations specify—
 - (a) a kind of animal that is to be regarded as wild,
 - (b) a kind of animal that is not to be regarded as wild,

for the purposes of this Act.

- (2) For the avoidance of doubt—
 - (a) whatever is done by regulations under subsection (1)(a) is without prejudice to the generality of section 2,
 - (b) the generality of section 2 is subject to whatever is done by regulations under subsection (1)(b).
- (3) Regulations under this section—
 - (a) may make different provision for different purposes,
 - (b) are subject to the affirmative procedure.>

13 After section 3, insert—

< Power to describe what is or is not a travelling circus

- (1) The Scottish Ministers may by regulations describe a particular type of undertaking, act, entertainment or similar thing that—
 - (a) is to be regarded as a travelling circus,
 - (b) is not to be regarded as a travelling circus,

for the purposes of this Act.

- (2) For the avoidance of doubt—
 - (a) whatever is done by regulations under subsection (1)(a) is without prejudice to the generality of section 3,
 - (b) the generality of section 3 is subject to whatever is done by regulations under subsection (1)(b).
- (3) Regulations under subsection (1)—
 - (a) may make different provision for different purposes,
 - (b) are subject to the affirmative procedure.>
