Introduction

1. This paper seeks to inform members' consideration of the following statutory instrument:

Energy Performance of Buildings (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 2015 (SSI 2015/386).

The Energy Performance of Buildings (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 2015 (SSI 2015/386)

Background

- 2. The instrument was laid on 18 November 2015 and this Committee has been designated the lead committee. The lead committee must report on the instrument by 11 January 2016.
- 3. The instrument is made under powers conferred by section 2(2) of the European Communities Act 1972(a) and sections 10 and 75 of the Energy Act 2011(b) and all other powers enabling them to do so.
- 4. Members will note this is a negative instrument. This means the instrument will come into force on the specified date unless a motion to annul has been agreed to by the Parliament within the 40 day period.

Policy Objectives

The Policy Note provided by the Scottish Government states---

"Amendments to existing regulations are to facilitate wider access to energy performance certificate data, as this is not personal data, and to strengthen the enforcement regime for energy performance certificates.

Changes to the regulations on access to energy performance data will extend access and the use of this data. The list of authorised recipients is expanded by regulation 2(10). In practical terms, these changes will improve access to information for building owners and the public, enable broader use of the energy performance data held on the Scottish Energy Performance Certificate Register and support publication of that data.

The role of an enforcement authority for the purpose of enforcement of the duties under the regulations, for example in respect of the display of energy performance certificates in public buildings, is to be extended to enable appointment of Local Authorities outwith their own area and potentially also of a third party. The aim is to remove any conflict of interest situation which may arise."

Financial Effects

5. The Minister for Local Government and Community Empowerment confirms the instrument has no financial effects on the Scottish Government, local government or on business.

Issues the Committee may wish to consider

- 6. The Delegated Powers and Law Reform Committee considered these Regulations at its meeting on 24 November 2015 and agreed that it had no comment to make.
- 7. No motion to annul this instrument has been lodged.
