Infrastructure Investment – Progress Update from the Scottish Government to the Public Audit Committee, dated 30 September 2014

I am pleased to provide the Public Audit Committee with the second report of the year on Major Capital Projects. The report reflects the recommendations made by Audit Scotland and the Committee to Scottish Government officials in August of this year.

Annex A

Annex A provides information on major capital projects with a value of more than £20 million where the Scottish Government has a lead role in procurement or funding. It also includes school projects which are being delivered through the Scotland's Schools for the Future Programme and those health projects being taken forward through the Scotland-wide 'hub' initiative which form part of the Scotlish Government's current £2.5 billion revenue funded NPD/hub investment pipeline. Links are once again provided within the annex to information on unitary charge payments relating to revenue funded NPD/hub projects which are in construction and where costs have been finalised.

Annex B

Annex B provides information on the progress of projects within the Infrastructure Investment Plan which have a value of more than £20 million and are at Outline Business Case approved stage or beyond. It also includes school projects in construction which are being delivered by Scotland's Schools for the Future Programme as well as those health projects in construction which are being delivered by the Scotland-wide 'hub' initiative and which form part of the Scottish Government's current revenue funded £2.5 billion NPD/hub investment programme.

Annex B also provides the progress update information included in the previous Scottish Government progress update in March 2014, as well as an additional note which summarises key points and changes to those projects within Annex B since then.

Information relating to the contribution of each project to local economic development is provided on an annual basis as agreed with the Committee, and therefore is not included within this particular report.

Notes relating to the updated IIP - Project Pipeline

- 1. The 'IIP Project Pipeline' relates to those projects with a capital value of £20 million or more where the Scottish Government has a lead role in procurement or funding. It also includes school projects which are being delivered through the Scotland's Schools for the Future Programme and those health projects being taken forward through the Scotland-wide 'hub' initiative which form part of the Scottish Government's current revenue funded £2.5 billion NPD/hub investment programme. The majority of the information relates to that as of 15 August 2014. However if there has been a significant change in the status of a project between this date and 25 September 2014, then information relating to that project has been updated as is relevant."
- 2. The following projects within the previously published pipeline in March 2014 are now operational and are subsequently no longer included.

- 3. Local authorities are the public sector procurement bodies for all schools within the Scotland's Schools for the Future programme, supported by Scottish Futures Trust. DG Learning & Justice relates to the area within the Scottish Government which has responsibility for the schools investment programme. For V&A at Dundee, Dundee City Council is the procurement body and DG Strategy & External Affairs relates to the area within the Scottish Government which has responsibility for Scottish Government's support for the project.
- 4. The Total Capital Investment estimates include the construction contract costs and any associated capital funded costs such as land acquisition and enabling works (e.g. demolition and utilities diversions). For revenue funded projects, the contract values, which represent the value of the Scottish Government funded construction activity associated with the project, have also been provided in order to provide transparency around delivery of the current revenue funded £2.5 billion NPD/hub investment programme. For all projects in development through Scotland's Schools for the Future programme, the Total Capital Investment relates to the estimated project cost of each school based on the metrics used for the Programme. - 5. Estimated costs for individual projects will change until the project has reached completion. Cost estimates for individual projects may rise or fall for a number of reasons, including: changes to the scope of the project; incurring unanticipated or additional costs for preparatory works; costs arising from unavoidable delay to projects; and increases in input costs and construction prices.
- 6. An estimate for inflation over the delivery period is included unless otherwise specified (e.g. 2012 prices). Exceptions include those projects where it is too early to provide an estimate or those projects where costs are contractually fixed. How inflation is managed will vary between contracts and will depend on how far the project has progressed in its delivery.
- 7. All figures rounded to the nearest £100,000.
- 8. For revenue funded NPD projects, links have been provided to the schedule of estimated unitary payment charges which will be paid over the lifetime of the contracts where projects have reached financial close and are in construction (DBFM is an acronym for Design, Build, Finance & Maintain).

- 9. Those projects which do not have an Outline Business Case approved (or equivalent) have been marked as 'In Preparation' whilst those projects being procured by way of the hub initiative which are not yet in construction, have been marked as 'Pre hub Development' or 'In hub Development'. Estimated delivery dates for these projects are provided where known.
- 10. Project milestones relate to the principal construction contract for each of the projects included. Contracting and procurement processes vary for those projects being delivered by way of Network Rail, the hub initiative or Framework Agreements. Consequently these projects have 'n/a' (not applicable) for 'Project Advertised to Market'. Estimated delivery dates for these projects are provided where known. Timescale estimates for individual projects may be lengthened or shortened for a number of reasons, including: changes to the scope of the projects; unanticipated or unavoidable delays to construction; unanticipated or unavoidable delays in the procurement process; and the impact of considerations around affordability for the procuring authority.
- 11. - 12. The main DBFM (Design, Build, Finance & Maintain) contract has not yet reached Financial Close. However the school project is in construction by way of an early works contract.
- 13. Land position has meant the project has temporarily stopped. Revised Statutory Consultation Process may be required before construction can commence onsite.
- 14. Both schools have now been reprofiled in line with Glasgow City Council's wider Primary School investment programme and are being delivered as two schools within one building project.
- 15. Estimated costs and delivery timescales have not been included due to the possibility of a Public Local Inquiry.

This is the first of twelve major dualling schemes within the A9 dualling programme. The scheme which entered procurement in August 2014 comprises a 7.5km stretch of dual-carriageway to the south of Aviemore.

NHS Orkney New Hospital and Healthcare Facilities

The new build integrated rural general hospital forms part of the Scottish Government's revenue funded NPD/hub investment programme and entered procurement in July 2014.

NHS Lanarkshire Primary Care Health Centres

The construction of three community health centres in East Kilbride, Kilsyth and Wishaw commenced in January 2014 and are being delivered by way of the Scottish Government's revenue funded NPD/hub investment programme.

Brechin High School

Project forms part of Scotland's Schools for the Future programme and commenced construction in June 2014.

Inverness Royal Academy

Project forms part of Scotland's Schools for the Future programme and commenced construction in July 2014.

Clyde Valley High School

Project forms part of Scotland's Schools for the Future programme and commenced construction in May 2014.

HMP Edinburgh - Women's Regional Unit

The project which comprises the provision of a new regional unit at Saughton entered procurement in June 2014.

Inverness Campus

Notable events and announcements relating to projects within Annex B since last Progress Update in March 2014

V&A Museum

In September 2014 BAM Construction was announced as preferred bidder to build the new V&A Museum building on Dundee Waterfront. The museum is the V&A's first permanent branch outside its London home.

NHS Dumfries & Galloway's Royal Acute Services Redevelopment project

In September 2014 High Wood Health was announced as preferred bidder to build the new district general hospital at the western end of Dumfries by-pass. The project forms part of the Scottish Government's revenue funded NPD/hub investment programme.

Aberdeen Western Peripheral Route/Balmedie Tipperty project

In August 2014 Connect Roads was announced as the preferred bidder for the main works contract which forms part of the Scottish Government's revenue funded NPD/hub investment programme. Preparatory works have already begun in relation to a pre-start works agreement with the preferred bidder which enables them to undertake further designs and to begin works including fencing, environment surveys and ground investigations ahead of the main works contract which is expected later this year.

NHS Ayrshire & Arran Acute Mental Health & North Ayrshire Community Hospital

In June 2014 the project reached financial close and construction commenced in July. The project which forms part of the Scottish Government's revenue funded NPD/hub investment programme will provide a new 206-ensuite bedroom integrated mental health and community development which will bring together a comprehensive range of outpatient and in-patient facilities.

Ayrshire College's Kilmarnock Campus

In June 2014 the project reached financial close and construction commenced in the same month. The project which forms part of the Scottish Government's revenue funded NPD/hub investment programme will deliver state of the art learning facilities.

Alford Academy

In May 2014 the main Design, Build, Finance & Maintain contract reached Financial Close and project commenced main construction. The school had previously been reported as being in construction by way of a contract relating to early works which formed part of the project value supported by the Schools for the Future Programme and which were required to be completed prior to the main DBFM contract reaching Financial Close.

Edinburgh-Glasgow Improvement Programme

In May 2014 the first electric trains took to the tracks on the £80 million Cumbernauld-Glasgow line which marked the successful completion of this part of the programme. Quieter, more regular and more reliable trains are now able to run on the line and the enhanced timetables sees more than twice as many services, meaning over double the previous capacity. The launch of these electric services is a huge milestone for the programme and the Cumbernauld electrification was delivered on time, on budget and well ahead of the summer's Commonwealth Games.

NHS Ayrshire and Arran's Building For Better Care

In May 2014 the contract was awarded for this project which includes the redesign of 'Front Door' services by enhancing level of Accident & Emergency Services delivered by Consultants in Emergency Medicine at Ayr (South Ayrshire) and Crosshouse Hospitals (East Ayrshire). Construction commenced at Ayr in May and at Crosshouse in mid-June.
