

I am writing to follow up on the outstanding issues that were raised at the RACCE Committee session on Wednesday 26 March 2014. I have set out our response below:

 You asked for a breakdown in simple tabular form of projects in the SRDP that have been approved by type, size and distribution, and the numbers that are legacy projects.

The tables contained within annex A and B provide a breakdown of Agri-environment scheme and projects by type, size and distribution.

 Graeme Dey asked whether the €70,000 grant in respect of new entrant support under pillar 2 would cover livestock acquisition as well as machinery, equipment and upgrading of buildings.

The new entrant start-up grant can cover just about anything as long as the business plan justifies it. This includes livestock, and even the purchase of land. The current proposals have been discussed with the New Entrant expert panel and their view is that the purchase of land would be an inefficient use of the grant, so we are likely to rule this out of the new scheme. The previous scheme did not support the purchase of land either and given the maximum grant amount available this is likely to have no bearing on land purchase decisions.
