Further to my appearance before the Committee on 3 June in connection with the draft Water Environment and Water Services (Scotland) Act 2013 (Modification of Part 1) Regulations 2015, I am pleased to enclose as requested further information regarding the priority substances for which changes are introduced by these Regulations.

I attach a table which lists both the new substances and those for which the environmental requirements have been revised – some have tighter environmental standards but may still be used, others must be phased out. This table also describes the type of activity for which these substances are normally used; and our assessment of the implications of the changes introduced by these Regulations.

As I explained to the Committee, the impact of these changes will be fairly limited in Scotland as the vast majority of these substances have already been banned or withdrawn from use, and been replaced by less harmful products. We will continue to press the European Commission and UK Government to take appropriate action regarding the remaining substances.

Meanwhile the key tasks arising from the Regulations will fall on the Scottish Environment Protection Agency and Scottish Water to monitor and identify any pollution hotspots where action such as additional wastewater treatment may be necessary, feasible and proportionate.

I hope the Committee finds this information useful.
