## **CAP PAYMENTS UPDATE**

I am writing to give the Committee the standard weekly update on progress with CAP payments figures as at 2 March.

I would also like to give an update about other actions that we are taking. At a meeting with industry stakeholders this afternoon I discussed with them proposals for supporting our most vulnerable farmers and crofters in the most remote and rural areas. Less Favoured Area Support Scheme payments are normally made in March. To avoid delays we are taking action using Scottish Government funds to ensure that the vast majority of claimants will receive payments in March as usual.

Under the Scottish Government's National LFASS Scheme, funded wholly by the Scottish Government, around 8,000 farmers will receive a payment worth 90 per cent of last year's claim, while another 1,400 crofters and small farmers who are eligible for the minimum LFASS payment of £385 will receive that in full. The level of payment to the remainder of eligible claimants will depend on various factors including changes to their land since 2014. Support under this scheme would be offset against the claimant's final LFASS payment. *De minimis* state aid rules will apply.

As you know, I will continue to provide further updates on a weekly basis and share the same information with stakeholder organisations.
